Today's Gospel is familiar and beloved—the Beatitudes. In Matthew's writing, it is called the Sermon on the Mount and directed to the disciples. In Luke, Jesus talks to the multitude on the plain. Refrain from selecting only music that restates the Beatitudes.

If you're planning ahead, consider this: see NPM's May 2009 NPM *Pastoral Music Notebook*. In his "Recitative" column, Dr. Joe Pellegrino reviewed Advent/Christmas octavos by OCP composers.

For those of you who are studying liturgy, Ken Cando's new book is a must! *Keep the Fire Burning* (OCP 6152TL) is a history of the folk Mass revolution from 1960 to 1970. Father Virgil Funk writes in his foreword: "Classically trained musicians, formally trained liturgists, parish priests, conservatives, liberals, folk musicians, or whatever label you attach to the 'autobiography of your ear'—[Ken] has done all of us an immense service by having written an honest, though clearly slanted, history of the folk Mass in the United States between the years 1960 and 1970, and he has written it from various perspectives." For example, did you know that Dennis Fitzpatrick, the editor of the first "folk hymnal," was a classically trained musician? Do you know who the F.E.L. (Friends of English in the Liturgy) were who financed the hymnal? What role did the bishops play? It was what it was—the living faith of people. Enjoy!

We end this issue as we began (see From the Editor, p. 2), looking, as Galileo did, to the heavens for perspective. At Christmas, the heavens proclaimed the birth of Christ. Strengthened by the Incarnation, we turn our gaze toward Lent, the season of grace. — Elaine Rendler-McQueeney

Let this be an opportunity to reflect on the funeral rites as they are celebrated in your community and as they are presented in the *Order of Christian Funerals*. Resources include *Facing Death Together: Parish Funerals* and *Now and at the Hour of Our Death, Revised Edition: Important Information Concerning My Medical Treatment, Finances, Death and Funeral* (Liturgy Training Publications, 800-933-1800, ltp.org); and the pamphlets *Roman Catholic Funeral Rites* and *The Church and Cremation* and the series of bulletin inserts *Life Is Changed Not Ended* (available in English and Spanish, Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions, 202-635-6990, fdlc.org).

*Take Me Home: Notes on the Church Year for Children* (Liturgy Training Publications, 800-933-1800, ltp.org) has reproducible pages for today's observance of Saint Valentine's Day as well as Mardi Gras this coming Tuesday and Ash Wednesday this coming Wednesday.

*Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers, Revised Edition* (172; USCCB Publishing, 800-235-8722, usccb.org) has a prayer for Monday's observance of President's Day.

### BLESSED

Luke's Gospel tells how Jesus spoke to a large number of people who had gathered to be healed and to hear him. Jesus expanded the meaning of the golden rule, illustrating with the "blesseds"—those goalposts of holiness. We come closest to the reign of God by being poor or hungry or by weeping. When we are hated or insulted on account of the Son of Man, on that day can we rejoice and leap for joy! Acting as God acts toward us opens us to great reward through the Messiah, the Christ.
